Notices of Motion Received

"In view of the adverse publicity that the Council received following the CIPFA report issued last September but not, at the time, made available to all members, Council resolves to ensure that the development of the 2019/2020 budget involves an open and transparent process in which all political groups on the Council are involved.

Council recognises that setting the budget is a statutory responsibility for all councillors and accepts that all members must be aware of the details of the Council's financial situation on which the budget is built when they cast their vote."
