	12. Notice of Motion standing in the names of Mrs E B Tucker, Prof. J Raine, Mrs F M Oborski, Mr T A L Wells, Mr M E Jenkins and Mrs S Askin:
	"It has recently come to light that the Joint Committee that governs Worcestershire Regulatory Services (WRS) voted some months ago to seek a private sector partner with which to grow its business – a business that is largely about public protection, and the prevention of harm of one form or another. The idea of a public-private partnership here represents a significant change in the delivery model that was agreed when the seven councils of Worcestershire first established WRS some five years ago.
	It is important that members of this council have an opportunity to debate such a proposal before any further actions are taken in seeking a private sector partner. Accordingly, we request that due time be assigned for councillors as soon as possible – to consider the case for and against the proposed and also to consider other possible options for ensuring the required level of service, the continuing viability and the value for money of Worcestershire's regulatory services, in particular Trading Standards."
