The Commandery Redevelopment Programme 2014 - 2019



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The Commandery is one of seven exceptional Grade I listed buildings in Worcester; a site that has been witness to the conflicts and the successes of the city for over a thousand years.

Significant investment in 2006/7 stabilised the historic and fragile structure and the site has welcomed over 125,000 visitors, event attendees, commercial bookings and school parties since the re-opening.

Now the facilities need to develop to better provide for all visitors and to reach out to those further away, encouraging more tourists into the historic city of Worcester. It needs to respond to the opportunities of the new national curriculum and the specific needs of its local community.

Funding from Arts Council England in 2013/14 has enabled Museums Worcestershire to intensively consult with visitors and with non-visitors, and to test the opportunities of the market for The Commandery. We aim to develop the work of the historic site in a series of phases over the next five years, with each phase targeted to different needs in partnership with specialist groups.


