Project

LP3 Promote positive change to landowners, managers, developers etc.

Malvern Wells Parish Council has agreed to a proposal to manage the grassland on the Village Green in a way that should extend the area of nature conservation interest on the site.

HP1 Conserve and enhance the historic and cultural environment of the AONB

Hope End Park Conservation Management Plan
Consultants have completed survey work and produced a
Management Plan for Hope End Park. The draft has been
discussed with owners and sent to staff at Natural England
and Historic England. Comments are being incorporated into
a revised draft. Discussions about works that could be funded
via FiPL are now taking place with owners.

FP2 Bring woodlands, orchards and other characteristic habitats into favourable conservation condition through encouraging and supporting management regimes that provide an economic return.

Woodland Management Plans

A Woodland Management Consultant is working on our behalf to help prepare woodland management plans and to advise owners.

Severn Treescapes

Planning

In June 22 staff at the AONB Unit joined with staff from the Cotswolds National Landscape to give a presentation to planners and heritage officers from Malvern and Wychavon re planning issues and good practice in the AONBs.

Planning Officer

Unit staff are working with colleagues in the Wye Valley AONB Unit to recruit a shared Planning Officer.

Recreational impacts study

The Malvern Hills Trust has commissioned advice to better understand the extent of recreational damage being done to the SSSI on the hills and what can be done to manage it. It is hoped that developer contributions will be help to finance necessary management in the future.

Malvern Wells Information Boards

We are working with Malvern Wells Parish Council to put up some information boards about grassland management on sites being managed by the Council.

Website Revamp

Following the liquidation of our former website developers, we have now engaged another local provider – Design in the Shires – to help us. The site is continuing to evolve. We helped out with the celebration of the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee, by lighting a gas beacon on the Herefordshire Beacon. We made a short video of the event.

Ledbury Poetry Festival

Together with Ledbury Poetry Festival we dedicated 4 walks with poets, authors and youth poets. There's a <u>dedicated page</u> on the website to the event.

Well-being day



We held a well-being day at Barton Court, this highlighted many of the activities that can be done in this beautiful landscape, that improve both mind and body.

Dance Film

We ran a fully-booked premiere of the modern dance film created over lock down, that showed the healing virtues of the Malvern landscape. It will be shown at the Exeter Dance International Film Festival in October.

NAAONB conference

In September AONB staff attended the national AONB conference, whose theme was diversity and inclusivity. We are now taking up the challenge of making our activities, communications and groups more accessible to a wider range of people. We hope to commission desk research shortly to find out both who does and who doesn't currently engage with the AONB, before beginning activities and conversations to find out more about how we can be more accessible.
